PSALM 46 Deus noster refugium

- 1 GOD is our 'hope and 'strength: a very 'present' help in 'trouble.
- 2 Therefore will we not fear, though the 'earth be 'moved : and though the hills be carried 'into the 'midst of the 'sea;
- 3 Though the waters thereof 'rage and 'swell: and though the mountains shake at the 'tempest' of the 'same.
- 4 The rivers of the flood thereof shall make glad the 'city of 'God: the holy place of the tabernacle' of the 'most' Highest.
- 5 God is in the midst of her, therefore shall she not 'be re'moved: God shall 'help her and 'that right 'early.
- 6 The heathen make much ado and the 'kingdoms are 'moved : but God hath shewed his voice, and the 'earth shall 'melt a'way.
- 7 The Lord of 'hosts is 'with us: the God of 'Jacob' is our 'refuge.
- 8 O come hither and behold the 'works of the 'Lord: what destruction he hath 'brought up'on the 'earth.
- 9 He maketh wars to cease in 'all the 'world : he breaketh the bow, and knappeth the spear in sunder, and burneth the 'chariots' in the 'fire.
- 10 Be still then and know that 'I am' God: I will be exalted among the heathen, and I will be ex'alted 'in the 'earth.
- 11 The Lord of 'hosts is 'with us: the God of 'Jacob' is our 'refuge.

PSALM 47 Omnes gentes, plaudite

- 1 O CLAP your hands together 'all ye 'people : O Sing unto 'God with the 'voice of 'melody.
- 2 For the Lord is high and ' to be ' feared : he is the great ' King upon ' all the '
- 3 He shall subdue the 'people' under us: and the 'nations' under our' feet.
- 4 He shall choose out an 'heritage 'for us : even the worship of 'Jacob 'whom he 'loved.
- 5 God is gone up with a 'merry 'noise: and the 'Lord with the 'sound of the 'trump.
- 6 O sing praises, sing praises 'unto our 'God: O sing praises, sing 'praises 'unto our 'King.
- 7 For God is the King of 'all the 'earth: sing ye 'praises with 'under'standing.
- 8 God reigneth 'over the 'heathen: God sitteth up'on his 'holy' seat.
- 9 The princes of the people are joined unto the people of the 'God of 'Abraham: for God, which is very high exalted, doth defend the 'earth as it 'were with a 'shield.

THE EPISTLE Romans 12.1-5

We sit

The Epistle is taken from St Paul's Epistle to the Romans, Chapter 12, beginning at the 1st verse.

I appeal to you therefore, brothers and sisters, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship. Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your minds, so that you may discern what is the will of God—what is good and acceptable and perfect.

For by the grace given to me I say to everyone among you not to think of yourself more highly than you ought to think, but to think with sober judgement, each according to the measure of faith that God has assigned. For as in one body we have many members, and not all the members have the same function, so we, who are many, are one body in Christ, and individually we are members one of another.

This is the word of the Lord. Thanks be to God.

GOSPEL READING

The holy gospel is written in the 2nd chapter of the gospel according to Saint Luke, beginning at the 41st verse.

Glory be to thee, O Lord.

Now every year his parents went to Jerusalem for the festival of the Passover. And when he was twelve years old, they went up as usual for the festival. When the festival was ended and they started to return, the boy Jesus stayed behind in Jerusalem, but his parents did not know it. Assuming that he was in the group of travellers, they went a day's journey. Then they started to look for him among their relatives and friends. When they did not find him, they returned to Jerusalem to search for him. After three days they found him in the temple, sitting among the teachers, listening to them and asking them questions. And all who heard him were amazed at his understanding and his answers. When his parents saw him they were astonished; and his mother said to him, 'Child, why have you treated us like this? Look, your father and I have been searching for you in great anxiety.' He said to them, 'Why were you searching for me? Did you not know that I must be in my Father's house?' But they did not understand what he said to them. Then he went down with them and came to Nazareth, and was obedient to them. His mother treasured all these things in her heart.

And Jesus increased in wisdom and in years, and in divine and human favour.

This is the Gospel of the Lord. Praise be to thee, O Christ.

We stand to sing

I believe in one God the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, and of all things visible and invisible:

Give grace, O heavenly Father, to all bishops, priests and deacons, that they may both by their life and doctrine set forth thy true and lively word, and rightly and duly administer thy holy sacraments: and to all thy people give thy heavenly grace; and specially to this congregation here present; that, with meek heart and due reverence, they may hear and receive thy holy word; truly serving thee in holiness and righteousness all the days of their life.

And we most humbly beseech thee of thy goodness, O Lord, to comfort and succour all them, who in this transitory life are in trouble, sorrow, need, sickness, or any other adversity.

And we also bless thy holy name for all thy servants departed this life in thy faith and fear; beseeching thee to give us grace so to follow their good examples, that with them we may be partakers of thy heavenly kingdom.

Almighty God, our heavenly Father, who of thy tender mercy didst give thine only Son Jesus Christ to suffer death upon the cross for our redemption; who made there (by his one oblation of himself once offered) a full, perfect and sufficient sacrifice, oblation and satisfaction for the sins of the whole world; and did institute, and in his holy gospel command us to continue, a perpetual memory of that his precious death, until his coming again:

who, in the same night that he was betrayed, took bread;

And, when he had given thanks, he brake it,

And, when he had given thanks, he gave it to them saying, Drink ye all of this; For this is my blood of the new testament, which is shed for you and for many, for the remission of sins: do this, as oft as ye shall drink it, in remembrance of me.

Wherefore, O Lord and heavenly Father, we thy humble servants entirely desire thy fatherly goodness mercifully to accept this our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving; most humbly beseeching thee to grant, that by the merits and death of thy Son Jesus Christ, and through faith in his blood, we and all thy whole Church may obtain remission of our sins, and all other benefits of his passion.

And here we offer and present to thee, O Lord, ourselves, our souls and bodies to be a reasonable, holy and lively sacrifice unto thee; humbly beseeching thee, that all we, who are partakers of this holy communion, may be fulfilled with thy grace and heavenly benediction.

And although we be unworthy, through our manifold sins, to offer unto thee any sacrifice, yet we beseech thee to accept this our bounden duty and service; not weighing our merits, but pardoning our offences, through Jesus Christ our Lord; by whom and with whom, in the unity of the Holy Ghost, all honour and glory be unto thee, O Father almighty, world without end. **Amen**.

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
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
