Every generous act of giving, with every perfect gift, is from above, coming down from the Father of lights, with whom there is no variation or shadow due to change. In fulfilment of his own purpose he gave us birth by the word of truth, so that we would become a kind of first fruits of his creatures.

You must understand this, my beloved: let everyone be quick to listen, slow to speak, slow to anger; for your anger does not produce God's righteousness. Therefore rid yourselves of all sordidness and rank growth of wickedness, and welcome with meekness the implanted word that has the power to save your souls.

But be doers of the word, and not merely hearers who deceive themselves. For if any are hearers of the word and not doers, they are like those who look at themselves in a mirror; for they look at themselves and, on going away, immediately forget what they were like. But those who look into the perfect law, the law of liberty, and persevere, being not hearers who forget but doers who act—they will be blessed in their doing.

If any think they are religious, and do not bridle their tongues but deceive their hearts, their religion is worthless. Religion that is pure and undefiled before God, the Father, is this: to care for orphans and widows in their distress, and to keep oneself unstained by the world.

Now when the Pharisees and some of the scribes who had come from Jerusalem gathered around him, they noticed that some of his disciples were eating with defiled hands, that is, without washing them. (For the Pharisees, and all the Jews, do not eat unless they thoroughly wash their hands, thus observing the tradition of the elders; and they do not eat anything from the market unless they wash it; and there are also many other traditions that they observe, the washing of cups, pots, and bronze kettles.) So the Pharisees and the scribes asked him, 'Why do your disciples not live according to the tradition of the elders, but eat with defiled hands?' He said to them, 'Isaiah prophesied rightly about you hypocrites, as it is written,

"This people honours me with their lips,

but their hearts are far from me;

in vain do they worship me,

teaching human precepts as doctrines."

You abandon the commandment of God and hold to human tradition.'

Then he called the crowd again and said to them, 'Listen to me, all of you, and understand: there is nothing outside a person that by going in can defile, but the things that come out are what defile.' For it is from within, from the human heart, that evil intentions come: fornication, theft, murder, adultery, avarice, wickedness, deceit, licentiousness, envy, slander, pride, folly. All these evil things come from within, and they defile a person.'

This is the Gospel of the Lord. Praise to you, O Christ.

BAPTISM of Éléonore Marie Catherine Mico

We stand

The parents and godparents of Éléonore now move to the font stand before the priest and congregation. The priest asks:

Do you wish Éléonore to be baptized?

Parents and godparents: We do

The priest then addresses the whole congregation

Faith is the gift of God to his people.

In baptism the Lord is adding to our number those whom he is calling. People of God, will you welcome Éléonore and uphold her in her new life in Christ?

All: With the help of God, we will

Congregation are seated

The priest then says to the parents and godparents

Parents and godparents, the Church receives Éléonore with joy.

Today we are trusting God for her growth in faith.

Will you pray for her, draw her by your example into the community of faith and walk with her in the way of Christ?

Parents and godparents: With the help of God, we will

In baptism Éléonore begins her journey in faith. You speak for her today. Will you care for her, and help her to take her place within the life and worship of Christ's Church?

Parents and godparents: With the help of God, we will

The parents and godparents with $\'{E}l\'{e}$ onore stand before the priest, who says:

In baptism, God calls us out of darkness into his marvellous light.

To follow Christ means dying to sin and rising to new life with him.

Therefore I ask you on behalf of Éléonore:

Do you reject the devil and all rebellion against God?

Parents and godparents: I reject them.

Priest: Do you renounce the deceit and corruption of evil?

Parents and godparents: I renounce them.

Priest: Do you repent of the sins that separate us from God and neighbour?

Parents and godparents: I repent of them.

Priest: Do you turn to Christ as Saviour?

Parents and godparents: I turn to Christ.

Priest: Do you submit to Christ as Lord?

Parents and godparents: I submit to Christ.

Priest: Do you come to Christ, the way, the truth and the life?

Parents and godparents: I come to Christ.

All Stand

The priest then makes the Sign of the Cross on Éléonore's forehead with the Oil of the Catechumens. This is a reminder of God's preparation of us for his service, by grace.

As she signs with the Cross, the priest says:

Éléonore, Christ claims you for his own. Receive the sign of his cross.

Do not be ashamed to confess the faith of Christ crucified.

All: Fight valiantly as a disciple of Christ against sin, the world and the devil, and remain faithful to Christ to the end of your life.

Priest: May almighty God deliver you from the powers of darkness, restore in you the image of his glory, and lead you in the light and obedience of Christ.

All: Amen

The priest now blesses the water which will be used for the Baptism:

Praise God who made heaven and earth,

All: who keeps his promise for ever.

Priest: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

All: It is right to give thanks and praise.

We thank you, almighty God, for the gift of water to sustain, refresh and cleanse all life.

Over water the Holy Spirit moved in the beginning of creation.

Through water you led the children of Israel from slavery in Egypt to freedom in the Promised Land.

In water your Son Jesus received the baptism of John and was anointed by the Holy Spirit as the Messiah, the Christ, to lead us from the death of sin to newness of life.

We thank you, Father, for the water of baptism. In it we are buried with Christ in his death. By it we share in his resurrection. Through it we are reborn by the Holy Spirit. Therefore, in joyful obedience to your Son, we baptize into his fellowship those who come to him in faith.

Now sanctify this water that, by the power of your Holy Spirit, they may be cleansed from sin and born again. Renewed in your image, may they walk by the light of faith and continue for ever in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Lord; to whom with you and the Holy Spirit be all honour and glory, now and for ever. **All:** Amen.

We remain standing for the profession of faith

Brothers and sisters, I ask you to profess together with Éléonore the faith of the Church.

Do you believe and trust in God the Father?

All: I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Do you believe and trust in his Son Jesus Christ?

All: I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come to judge the living and the dead.

Do you believe and trust in the Holy Spirit?

All: I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

The priest asks a parent or godparent: How do you name this child?

and the child's name is given.

The priest then baptizes the child, saying:

Éléonore Marie Catherine Mico, I baptize you in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

All: Amen.

All are seated

The priest then addresses the parents, godparents and whole congregation:

We have brought this child to baptism knowing that Jesus died and rose again for her and trusting in the promise that God hears and answers prayer. We have prayed that in Jesus Christ she will know the forgiveness of her sins and the new life of the Spirit.

As she grows up, she will need the help and encouragement of the Christian community, so that she may learn to know God in public worship and private prayer, follow Jesus Christ in the life of faith, serve her neighbour after the example of Christ, and in due course come to confirmation.

As part of the Church of Christ, we all have a duty to support her by prayer, example and teaching. As her parents and godparents, you have the prime responsibility for guiding and helping Éléonore in her early years. This is a demanding task for which you will need the help and grace of God. Therefore, let us now pray for grace in guiding her in the way of faith.

Faithful and loving God, bless those who care for this child and grant them your gifts of love, wisdom and faith. Pour upon them your healing and reconciling love, and protect their home from all evil. Fill them with the light of your presence and establish them in the joy of your kingdom, through Jesus Christ our Lord.

All: Amen.

Priest: Éléonore, today God has touched you with his love and given you a place among his people.

God promises to be with you in joy and in sorrow, to be your guide in life, and to bring you safely to heaven.

In baptism God invites you on a life-long journey.

Together with all God's people you must explore the way of Jesus and grow in friendship with God, in love for his people, and in serving others.

With us you will listen to the word of God and receive the gifts of God.

We return to our places, and we sit or kneel for our prayers of intercession.

Prayers of Intercession Lord, in your mercy hear our prayer.

Conclusion

We commend ourselves, and all for whom we pray, to the mercy and protection of God.

accept these prayers

for the sake of your Son,

our Saviour Jesus Christ. Amen.


It is right to give thanks and praise.

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
