I was licensed to HTC from September 2003 in order to establish the La Côte congregation as an independent chaplaincy.

My association with HTC continued throughout the 7 years of my ministry at La Côte and I was able to become involved more regularly with HTC Geneva when I moved on to found and lead the Anglican Health Network. My final months in Switzerland in 2014 were spent as a locum to HTC.

Before coming to Switzerland I was vicar of St. Philip's Church in Salford. I also had the historic

parish of Sacred Trinity Salford under my wing. This was during the period following the infamous IRA attack on Manchester in 1996 when major new regeneration initiatives precipitated a huge influx into the centre of the city, including to my 2 parishes.

Following my departure from Geneva I spent 20 months as interim priest in a parish in the New Forest before moving to Bodmin to be Team Rector for 5 parishes. Since 2016 I have been working here with a team of lay and ordained ministers to develop a wide array of mission activities within a town that has a high level of deprivation. To aid this I founded a social enterprise, Bodmin Way, to host and manage these activities. I was made Rural Dean in 2019.
