Council Members

- There is a total of *three* vacancies for elected membership of Council:
- These are all for the normal term of three years, i.e. from March 2018 to March 2021.

One current member of Council is standing for a further term. This does not prevent other people from also standing.

Archdeaconry Synod Representatives

- There are no current vacancies for the Archdeaconry Synod. Representatives are elected for a three-year cycle from April 2017 to April 2020.

Wardens

Church Wardens are elected for a one year term of office, and may be elected for six consecutive years before they must stand down. Nominees wishing to stand for election as a Church Warden should discuss this with the Chaplain in advance of completing the application form. Fred Samuels and Ann Shazell have indicated that they are willing to stand for re-election. This does not prevent other people from standing.

Electoral Roll

*Under the Church Representation Rules and Holy Trinity's Constitution people are entitled to have their names on the Electoral Roll if they:

- (i) are baptized and aged 16 or over
- (ii) are members of the Church of England (or of a Church in communion with the Church of England) and have habitually attended public worship in the Chaplaincy during the period of six months prior to enrolment.
- (iii) are members in good standing of a Church not in communion with the Church of England which subscribes to the doctrine of the Holy Trinity - who have habitually attended public worship in the Chaplaincy during the period of six months prior to enrolment, and who declare themselves to be also members of the Church of England.
