Dear Mr. Hampton

Will you, as Chaplain's Warden, be kind enough to lay the leave before the Church Committee, at their next meeting?

On October 14, Dr. Steiner wrote me a medical certificate, with which it was not possible to comply, prescribing a month's immediate leave, as a temporary measure. But both myself and my wife he suggested the desirability of a longer break, of three or even six months, to arrest this shakiness before it gets a stronger hold.

I am writing therefore to ask the Committee if, subject to proper provision for the church during my absence, they can see their way to granting me half-pay leave ^{of about 3 months and 9 days} from Dec. 22, 1935, to Sat. Mar. 23, 1936, after which I should hope for a renewed spell of work in Geneva.

Dr. Bata, Secy of the Colonial & Continental Church Society, writes that they would be unwilling to fund a man for the three months, but felt forced to come out with any other suitable suggestions.

London (19) Sunday would have the funds for, from Dec. 15, 1935, to March 15, 1936. but under Indian. (Easter Day 1936 falls on April 12.)

The date which I have put forward for my absence are determined by the sickness of a boy who would, I believe, do me a much good in any way, but for which friend has been looking for the 2 weeks.

I am sorry to be a burden on the church which has already been so generous.

D^r Bell (Secy of the Social, Industrial & Church Society) writes, "I should like to know whether you would delay what the local Committee are proposing to do in the matter of a stipend of a locum Tenens".

Below I submit proposals which may serve ^{as a basis} to start your deliberations. I think they are about

Financial Proposal to Society

Stipend offered - £ 7500 (625 p.m) + $\frac{1}{2}$ £ 6.10 from Gl. Co. direct to Treasurer, and by him made payable to the Chaplain.

Note The cost was formerly £5 p.m. The increase of $\frac{1}{2}$ £ 7.10 is a direct past result made to the Chaplain's funds. The Chaplain lays $\frac{1}{2}$ £ 25.00 to the Treasurer, & represents the £ 1.5.

Proposals

1. Pay Chaplain about half pay of the same allowance say £ 300 p.m. in sum, about 900 p.m. for the 3 months, he would need to repay about 100 p.m.
2. The locum Tenens Pay him monthly (or bi-monthly)

(a) Balance of past-charge	say	£ 325 p.m.
(b) The whole of the salary charges	say	$\frac{1}{2}$ £ 6.10 p.m.
3. Arrange for locum (single man) to stay at Bain (collected) - 44. Grosvenor House, close to Church at 8 p.m. a day = £ 240 p.m.
 (325 - 240) = margin of $\frac{1}{2}$ £ 85 p.m.
 $\frac{1}{2}$ £ 6.10 = (say) 95 p.m.

 Margin $\frac{1}{2}$ £ 100 p.m. [? + desirable]
4. Pay Travelling ^{24 shillings} both ways (single) man, covering for the whole time, (not say, for 3 men covering for a month each.)
