

## HOLY TRINITY CHURCH GENEVA SUMMARY OF ECUMENICAL RELATIONS

**Emmanuel Episcopal Church** is an Episcopal parish of the Convocation of Episcopal Churches in Europe, and a member of the Anglican Communion. They are a multinational congregation from a wide range of denominational and non-Christian backgrounds. Their services are in English each Sunday, and HTC hold a joint celebration with them several times a year and also with the Old Catholic Church. The Old Catholic Church, Geneva are in full communion with the Anglican Communion. They have two French-speaking parishes in Geneva, one in the Old Town, St. Germain and the other is Eglise de la Trinité, in Grand-Lancy. The Cursillo community is part of an ecumenical movement which organises two retreats a year, in May and November, in French and English, to enable Christians to further their knowledge and grow in their spiritual journey to become more active in their own church communities. Cursillo is a Spanish name for "small course". Members of HTC who have taken part in these retreats have found it very beneficial. Rassemblement des Eglises et Communautés Chretiennes de Genève (RECG) is an association of churches and Christian communities of Geneva, with representatives of the World Council of Churches (WCC). The RECG organise an ecumenical service during the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity, traditionally celebrated annually from 18-25 January in the northern hemisphere, or during Pentecost in the global South, and invites Christians worldwide to dedicate spiritual time for the sacred cause of Christian unity and to meet in prayer, regardless of their church or denominational identity. The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity is sponsored jointly by the Pontifical Council for Promoting Christian Unity and the World Council of Churches (WCC) Commission on Faith and Order.
